
BSP PROGRAM

BSP = BODY AND SEX POSITIVITY

Once again, you'll find BSP (body and sex positivity) events in the program. These events center around more sensitive and private subjects such as sexuality, sexual identity, the body, gender identity, and all the experiences you can have as an LGBTQIA+ person exploring yourself and the world around you. Our BSP content is presented through workshops, debates, presentations and salons, and these activities can include very specific details about gender, bodies, and sexual experiences, even if it isn't the main focus of the event. Unless otherwise stated, all genders and sexualities are welcome. Since the topics of the BSP format deals with issues that can be sensitive, they require a more private space and for that reason there is a different set of guidelines for participants at these events, namely the following safer space guidelines:

- **The events will take place in a closed-off room where photography or filming is not allowed. Tagging the participants on social media is also not allowed.**
- **Doors close when the event begins. To avoid interruptions, it will NOT be possible to arrive late for BSP events. Please be on time.**
- **What happens in the room, stays in the room. Respect the discretion of all participants and do not discuss the event or mention personal information obtained from the event with people who were not present.**

BSP events create an intimate space for LGBTQIA+ people, and fortunately we know from experience that the majority of participants understand how to behave and know how to act with mutual respect and practice inclusivity. Bring a friend or come by yourself. Meet new people, stay curious and open-minded. Together, we are so much better.

THIS YEAR'S THEME: QUEERPLUS

It is our great pleasure to welcome you to Copenhagen Winter Pride Week 2023!

It is a new year and for Copenhagen Pride, we are looking towards the future with two words at the front of our minds: quality and equality. We understand that our movement belongs to the entire LGBTI+ community and we are committed to living up to this by being as inclusive, open, and accessible as we can be.

Building on that, the theme for Winter Pride 2023 is QueerPlus. QueerPlus is an exploration of overlapping identities and intersectionality. It is about recognizing the things that are unique to our experiences as LGBTI+ people besides from our sexual orientation and gender identity and to open up a conversation about how we all experience the world differently. Understanding our different perspectives is a vital part of understanding our community – and ultimately bring us closer together. This is vital at a time when so many want to create discord and division.

We invite you to join us by considering ways in which the QueerPlus theme applies to you or to your community. As people, our lived experiences are shaped by a kaleidoscope of intersecting identities and we want to give our community the chance to recognize, celebrate, and understand those identities. We want to create not just

a safer space but a *braver* space where people feel able and secure to talk about these experiences and intersecting identities.

The majority of Winter Pride Week will take place in Huset-KBH, located at Rådhusstræde 13 in central Copenhagen. All venues at Huset-KBH are wheelchair accessible. The elevator requires a key, and if you would like, you can let us know in advance that you are attending by emailing us at kontakt@copenhagenpride.dk. We will have a phone number available during the week for any inquiries about accessibility – more information can be found on our website and social media.

Copenhagen Pride is part of the sunflower scheme, which makes invisible disabilities visible and emphasizes that some people may require extra time, help, or patience. Read more on our website.

ARTWORK DETECTIVES AND QUEER HISTORY




